- Provide volunteers information, guidance and assistance as primary liaison between the volunteers and ATN staff.
- Engage with allied organizations to identify opportunities for collaboration
- Coordinate targeted community engagement efforts
- Staff tables at outside events and work with volunteers to staff tables
- Support staff in hosting Town Halls by being point person to assist staff in set-up for local events
- Ability to work irregular hours, to attend evening and weekend meetings, and travel to Harrisburg

- Willingness to learn and work as part of a team
- Commitment of 10 hours per month
